Learning Objectives and Outcomes

Students will be able to:

- Distinguish between the subgenres of nonfiction, including autobiography, biography, personal narrative, and memoir
- Delve into their own memories and participate in numerous prewriting, idea-generating activities for the purpose of writing a memoir piece
- Hone and publish a final writing product based on their own lives using the revision skills that professional writers use
- Interview a family or friend for the purpose of recording a story for preservation in the Voice Library archives
- Read published memoirs to analyze and inquire into the techniques of memoirists
- Reflect on their participation in the LMBYM project in order to realize the positive impact they have made on their communities
